In a spirit of mutual assistance each of the eight Irish Regions is twinned with Society members in an African country as part of the National Twinning Programme.

The Irish Regions are twinned as follows:

- North East & Midlands Region with Zimbabwe
- East Region with Zambia
- South East Region with The Gambia & Tanzania
- South West Region with Nigeria
- Mid West Region with Sierra Leone
- West Region with Malawi
- North West Region with Uganda & Kenya
- North Region with Ghana & Botswana

Each Region has a Twinning Officer who is responsible for the establishment of a Twinning Committee, which is the contact with the SVP members in the relevant countries. Twinning provides SVP members in Ireland with the opportunity to support their Vincentian brothers and sisters in Africa.



# NO BORDERS to SVP help

The concept of mutual assistance goes back to the foundation of the Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) in 1844.

This is encapsulated in one of the original rules of the Society which states:

"We should love one another now and ever, far and near. from conference to another. from town to town, from nation to nation."

In 1954 the Council General of the Society added an additional dimension to the work of SVP when it launched a Twinning Programme as a form of Christian solidarity, which helps members fulfil the universal mission of charity.

The **West Region** (Galway, Mayo and Roscommon) is twinned with **MALAWI** and together they have formed a close spiritual connection offering friendship and support to one another.

The projects operated by the SVP in Malawi and supported by the West Region have the primary goal of alleviating poverty and aiding people to become self-sufficient.



### AGRICULTURAL PROJECT

The SVP in Malawi use funding from Twinning to purchase fertiliser and sow maize to feed hungry families in their parishes. The families work in the fields and support themselves with the harvest. The surplus crops are sold and the profits are used to reinvest in similar projects leading to more sustainable futures for the families supported.



### **BAKERY AND GARDEN PROJECTS**

The West Region Twinning Group has provided funding to support a Conference in Malawi to establish and run a small bakery. This bakery provides fresh bread daily for the entire village of Chilumba. Profits from the bakery go towards supporting those in greatest need in the community. Funding has also been approved for the establishment of a market garden, a pig farm and a poultry farm in other villages. These projects established by SVP are aimed at supporting sustainable living in the community.

#### **FLOOD RELIEF**

In 2015 heavy rains in Malawi resulted in massive flooding displacing more that 336,000 people. The floods destroyed homes, ravaged farmlands and compromised vital services such as clean water and sanitation. Funding was provided through the local SVP Conferences to assist in providing food, medical supplies and temporary accommodation.
