Service description: The Prison Visitor's Centre provides a supportive space, advice and guidance service for children and families visiting others in prison. There is also a play area for children aged 1 year+ for the additional support of children visiting Midlands Prison.

The written risk assessment indicates the areas of potential harm, the likelihood of harm occurring, and lists the required policy, guidance, process and practice required to alleviate the risks. It also highlights additional controls that can be put in place to mitigate against the identified risks.

- Procedures for appointing a relevant person for the purposes of the Statement.

SVP and Midlands Prison Visitor's Centre recognise that implementation is an ongoing process and we are committed to the implementation of this Child Safeguarding Statement and the procedures that support our intention to keep children safe from harm.
